What people can do to support you to vote:

- Explain the different voting options in a way that works for you
- Support you in the polling booth by standing with you
- Marking the paper for you if you want them to



What people can't do:

- Choose who you are voting for
- Writing on the ballot paper without your permission
- Tell you that you can't vote



Don't forget to bring a valid photo ID or a Voter Authority Certificate with you to vote.



Accepted photo IDs include a UK or Northern Ireland photocard driving licence, a Blue Badge and a disabled person's bus pass.
